Executive Director's Letter

Clean. Dry. Empty.

Residents all over Stark, Tuscarawas and Wayne Counties utilize our recycling bins and good things are happening. The District is changing how we operate to fit the needs of 21st century recyclers. Contamination is a recycling market problem and we are responding. Our new campaign is Clean, Dry, and Empty. We need your recyclables to be clean (no food, liquid or residue). We need the materials to be dry (as much as possible) and empty (with no items inside). We have simplified our labels on our bins to be clearer about what we take. Signs are being erected at our public drop offs further assisting residents and highlighting our "No Dumping" policy.

The District has made great strides in the last year and this year proves be to no different. As we embark on this journey to clean up our message and assist our residents, we implore you to help us. Help us to clean up recycling by:

1. Sorting your recycling at home
2. Give those metal cans, glass bottles and jars, and plastic bottles and jugs a quick rinse to remove any liquid, food or residue (Clean. Dry. Empty)
3. Keep those plastic caps on your plastic bottles and jugs
4. Only recycle loose paper (no shredded paper), flattened cardboard, glass bottles and jars, plastic bottles and jugs, and metal cans in our bins.

Cleaner recycling helps us all. Join us as we spread the message of Clean, Dry, and Empty



NO Plastic or Garbage Bags

Plastic bags and items made from thin plastic material (i.e. shrink wrap, bubble wrap, Ziploc bags, newspaper bags, trash bags, etc.) are the easiest things to remove from your recycling. Plastic bags are what we call “Tanglers.”

Plastic bags can wrap around the shafts and axles of a sorting machine and endanger the sorters who must remove them. When the machine breaks and the sorters must dig them out, that is time and energy wasted.



Plastic bags and clothing are tangles!



Clothing also has the potential to become a tangle within the sorting facilities. Clothing should be donated.

List of Unacceptable Items in Our Bins

NO Loose Shredded Paper

The most valuable trait of recyclable paper is its long paper fiber. This is because long fibers can stand up to multiple recycling cycles. When shredded-paper is mixed in with non-shredded paper, it is difficult to recover for recycling at a materials recovery facility. The small pieces fall and are unable to be sorted with the rest.




NO Appliances

Only food grade metal and aluminum cans are accepted at our recycling drop-offs. Appliances may be taken to a scrap metal recycling center.

NO Electronics and TVs

Electronics and flatscreen TVs can be taken to the Canton Recycling Center to be recycled. Tube TVs are not accepted and should be thrown away.





NO Tires

Though tires cannot be taken to our drop-offs, they are accepted at the Canton Recycle Center. Ten passenger/light trucks tires are allowable per resident per year. ID is required.

NO Hazardous Waste and Paint

Latex paint is not considered hazardous. It should be dried out with kitty litter, sawdust, or newspaper and set out with your trash. Hazardous waste and oil-based paint can be taken to the Canton Recycling Center. Call 330-489-3231 for information.



NO Yard Waste

Composting your yard waste reduces methane emissions from the landfills. Consider a District Yard Waste Dropoff or home composting. To learn more about composting or to find a yard waste drop-off near you, visit our website.

NO Toys

We only accept plastic bottles and jugs at our District Drop-offs. Large toys cannot be processed at our sorting facilities. Toys can be donated in your community.



NO Building Materials

Please contact your trash hauler for disposal of building materials.

The local Material Recovery Facility that processes The District's recycling is set up to handle specific materials for recycling. Their machines cannot process any non-accepted items. All other items have the potential to contaminate the recycling, break or damage machinery, and cause harm to facility workers.




NO Batteries

No batteries are accepted except lead acid batteries (ex. car batteries) All Alkaline batteries are non-hazardous and may be disposed of in your trash. You may take your other household non-rechargeable/rechargeable batteries to a participating Home Depot or Lowes. Check call2recycle.org for a more specific list of what they take.

NO Latex Paint

Latex paint that is not in good condition may be dried out using kitty litter, newspaper or sand. Once dried, it can be thrown away.




NO No Cylinders (Propane, Fire Extinguishers or other tanks)

Check out www.bluerhino.com for propane recycling of 20 lbs or more. Call your local scrapper to see what they require. Some will take it; others will not.

Small propane/butane canisters for a camp stove, lantern or torch (usually 2# or less) are not refillable and can be recycled through a scrap metal yard. If there is no scrap metal recycling available, and all the gas is released, the canister may be discarded in the trash.

Empty helium balloon tanks - Follow the disposal instructions that came with the tank or see the instructions at www.balloontime.com. Medical cylinders should be disposed of or recycled through the company it was purchased or received.
